Tatsuki Ohji is a Fellow of National Institute of Advanced Industrial Science and Technology (AIST), Japan. BS and MS in mechanical engineering from Nagoya Institute of Technology and Ph. D. in inorganic materials engineering from Tokyo Institute of Technology, he has authored more than 350 peer-reviewed papers and 20 books or book chapters, and has edited more than 40 books and conference volumes. His research interests include mechanical property characterization and microstructural design of ceramics and related materials. He currently serves as President-elect of the American Ceramic Society (President 2019-20). He is also a Governor of Acta Materialia, Inc., an Advisory Board member of the World Academy of Ceramics, and an Editor of "Journal of the American Ceramic Society, and "Ceramic International".

A Fellow of American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS), ASM International, the American Ceramic Society and the Ceramic Society of Japan, and an Academician of the World Academy of Ceramics, he has received numerous awards and honors, including John Jeppson Award, Samuel Geijsbeek PACRIM International Award, and ECD Bridge Building Award all from the American Ceramic Society, IIM Lectureship Award from ASM International, Aurel Stodola Honour Medal from the Slovak Academy of Sciences, IMR Lee Hsun Lecture Award from the Chinese Academy of Sciences, Bhagat Memorial Lecture Award from the Indian Ceramic Society, Academic Achievement Award of the Ceramic Society of Japan, and Distinguished Research Achievement Award of the Japan Society of Powder and Powder Metallurgy.
